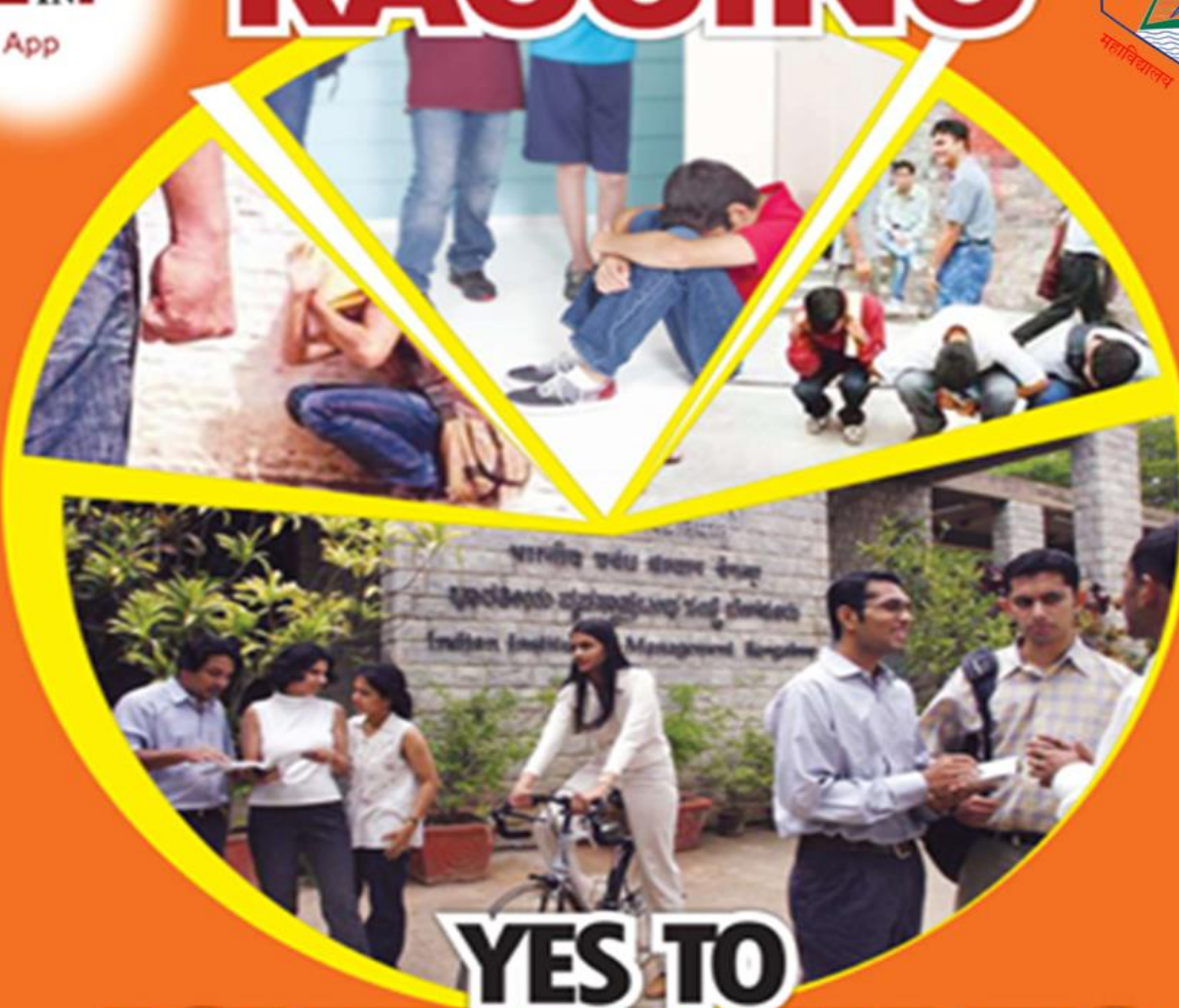

ABOUT COLLEGE

Government Degree College Nagrota Surian is located in Nagrota Surian, a Tehsil Headquarter under Sub-Division Jawali in District Kangra. The town lies on State Highway No. 22 (Jawalamukhi – Dehra – Jawali) and is a densely populated area, also serving as the Block Headquarters for 49 Gram Panchayats. The historically and strategically significant Pathankot–Joginder Nagar narrow gauge railway line also passes through this town.

Nagrota Surian is situated just 9 kilometers from the renowned monolithic rock-cut Masroor Temple and lies adjacent to the Ramsar-declared Pong Dam Lake—an internationally recognized wetland. This wetland serves as a major winter destination for migratory birds from Central Asia and Siberia. Before the creation of this man-made water body (Pong Dam), the valley was known as Haldoon Ghati.

The establishment of the college was announced by the Government of Himachal Pradesh in March 2013. Subsequently, Notification No. EDN-A-Ka(1)-1/2014 was issued on 15th January 2014. Classes for Arts and Commerce streams commenced under the RUSA (CBCS) system on 11th June 2014. In the academic session of 2017–18, Science streams (Medical and Non-Medical) were introduced, admitting 108 students.

As of now, the college has grown to strength of over 351 students. On 14th March 2021, the college was relocated to a newly constructed campus at Bantungli, approximately 3 kilometers from the original site in Nagrota Surian.

Our dedicated faculty have worked tirelessly throughout the year to provide students with a high-quality educational experience. Through debates, group discussions, seminars, quizzes, as well as cultural and sports events, we aim to ensure holistic development for our students.

b) Any change in the admission schedule, if notified by HP University, will be displayed on the notice board and on the college website. The admission to First Year shall be strictly on the basis of merit, and the roster reservation of HPU will be applicable.

DOCUMENTS/CERTIFICATES REQUIRED TO BE UPLOADED

1. Matriculation certificate for date of birth.
2. 10+2-mark sheet (Internet copy not valid).
3. Passport-size photograph.
4. Character certificate in original from the Head of the Institution last attended in case of regular candidates. Character certificate shall be issued by a gazetted officer or the panchayat pradhan in the case of private candidates.
5. The character certificate should not be older than six months on the day of submission of the admission form.
6. Certificates issued by competent authority for availing the benefit of reservation or relaxation in age in the category concerned, i.e., SC/ST/OBC/Person with Disabilities/Economically Weaker Section/Ex Serviceman (or EWS)/Ward of Freedom Fighter.
7. Any gap in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/affidavit as proof of his/her activities during the period of the gap.
8. H.P. Domicile certificate for exemption of tuition fee (for female candidates only).
9. An equivalence eligibility certificate from H.P. Board/H.P. University for the candidates who have passed 10+2 from a board other than the H.P. Board of School Education/CBSE/ICSE.
10. Migration certificates need to be submitted by candidates coming from boards/universities other than H.P. Board of School Education/H.P. University.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE & CRITERIA

Eligibility Conditions:

1. The applicant must have passed the +2 examination under 10+2 or an equivalent thereof of a board/university established by law in India with five subjects (including English or any language [subject to eligibility conditions] as a compulsory subject).
2. Applicants willing to take admission **to B.Sc. (Medical and Non-Medical) must have passed 10+2 examination** in four written subjects (including English) with Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics/Biology with 45% marks. For those who opt for life sciences, biology at 10+2 is compulsory.
3. The student of NIOS (National Institute of Open School) who has passed all five subjects, securing the requisite marks, will be admitted.
4. Provided that a student who has passed the qualifying exam in the Arts Stream with a minimum of 33% marks will be given preference in the BA programme.
5. Provided that a student who has passed the qualifying exam with a minimum of 40% marks in the Commerce Stream will be given preference in the B.Com. programme (33% for girls). Students from other streams opting for Commerce must have studied Economics or Mathematics at the +2 level and attained a minimum of 45% marks.
6. A student who has passed *Shashtri or Prak Shashtri* from Sanskrit Colleges affiliated with the HPU or *Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan* (Deemed University) under MHRD, Govt. of India, shall be eligible for admission to the Arts stream only, provided that the candidate has passed *Prak Shastri* or *Shastri* with English as one of the subjects.
7. The upper age limit for admission to B.A./B.Com. First Year is 23 years as of 1 July 2026, and for girls, it is **25 years as of 1 July 2026**. Age relaxation of three years is allowed in the case of SC/ST candidates.

The Vice Chancellor (VC) has the power to permit age relaxation, for reasons to be recorded in writing, up to a maximum of six months.

8. Merit will be worked out by taking into consideration the best of five subjects, including English as one of the subjects.
9. In case of a tie in selection, the candidate older in age shall be given weightage.
10. An applicant who fails to deposit the dues by the last date and time shall forfeit his/her right to admission, and the seat shall be offered to the next applicant in the merit list.
11. University Ordinance shall be strictly adhered to in admission to all the classes.
12. There is no provision of compartment in the National Open School, New Delhi. So, a candidate who failed in any one or more than one subject(s) is not eligible for admission to the college and will not be admitted as per university ordinance/rules.
13. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such a candidate.

Note: Changes (if any) in the guidelines and eligibility for admission will be notified as per the notification of Himachal Pradesh University Shimla. (For First Year Students)

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Read the instructions thoroughly before filling out the admission form for any course.

1. A candidate seeking admission to the first year should apply online. The form, complete in all respects, must be submitted through the college website.
2. Before applying for admission, students must obtain an APAAR (Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry) ID linked to DigiLocker and also sign an online anti-ragging pledge.
3. The eligibility criteria for admission to B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. in the first year are strictly as per the latest ordinances/guidelines/calendar notified by Himachal Pradesh University.
4. Candidates are required to upload the original documents and a recent passport- size photograph.
5. The admission form recommended by the admission committee and approved by the principal entitles a candidate to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated time period.
6. Change of subject is allowed only with the permission of the principal. A change of faculty, i.e., from science to arts or vice versa, is permissible only if the candidate has the required percentage of marks as specified for admission to that faculty.
7. College authorities may discontinue a course if adequate number of students are not available/ enrolled in that particular course.
8. Roster for reservation of seats in various categories shall be as per rules of H.P. University, Shimla
9. Incomplete admission forms will not be entertained.
10. All admissions will be as per the admission schedule notified by HP University from time to time.
11. Students admitted to the college will have to abide by all the rules and regulations of the college as stipulated in the prospectus/student's charter.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION FOR FIRST YEAR

1. Latest passport-size photographs.
2. Original copy of matriculation certificate.
3. Original copy of the 10+2 pass marks sheet issued by a recognised board.
4. H.P. Domicile certificate for girl students (for exemption of tuition fee).
5. An original character certificate from the head of the institution last attended in

case of a student seeking admission to the 1st year of any course.

6. A student seeking admission from a board/university other than H.P. will have to produce his/her migration certificate in original.
7. Gap Year Undertaking duly signed by the candidate to be uploaded wherever applicable.
8. SC/ST certificate from the Magistrate (Class-1) for seeking relaxation in age and benefit of reservation in the respective category.
9. Aadhar Card.
10. Affidavit of Single Girl Child (if Applicable).
11. Affidavit / Certificate related to the Economically Weaker Section of the Society.

IMPOTRANT INFORMATION

- **The Character Certificate must not have been issued more than six months prior to the date of admission.**
- **In case of gap year(s), the character certificate of the last attended institution must be supplemented by another character certificate obtained from a Gazetted Class-1 Officer or the Pradhan of the concerned Gram Panchayat or President of the concerned Nagar Panchayat / Municipality.**
- ***The candidate having a compartment at the 10+2 level is not eligible for admission.***
- **Students must furnish the information of their latest email and Aadhar number.**
- **The students seeking admission to the first semester/year (as per the HPU notification) will deposit their fee only after the merit list is displayed.**

ROSTER (120 POINT)

Our institution follows the reservation policy of H.P. Government and H.P. University, Shimla in admissions. The following reservations are available, which are filled according to the reservation roster devised by H.P. University, Shimla:

These reservations will be applicable to:

- Those who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or from any other Schools located within territorial Jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or Bonafide resident of Himachal Pradesh.
- Sports and cultural seats will be allotted to those events which are recognized by HPU sports and co-curricular council.

- The final decision under sports and cultural quota will be with the respective committees constituted for the same.

As per the notification issued by the Government of Himachal Pradesh, the undergraduate programmes in all Degree Colleges across the state shall adopt the Semester System from the academic session 2026–27 in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The Government has also approved the implementation of the Multiple Entry and Exit Scheme at the undergraduate level, providing flexibility to students in pursuing and completing their education. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

In the academic year 2013-14, with the purpose of ensuring uniformity in the standards of higher education and to provide the students quality education on par with the best in India, the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced under RUSA by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. This system was replaced in the academic year 2016-17 by the University Grants Commission (UGC) prescribed framework of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). In the year 2018-19, the academic council of Himachal Pradesh University decided to switch over from the CBCS system to the annual system of examination.

The choice-based credit system (CBCS) provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core courses (DSC), elective courses (DSE), skill-based courses (SEC) and generic courses (GE). The courses can be evaluated following the “grading” system, which is considered to be better than the conventional “marks” system. This uniform grading system will benefit the students in institutions within India and around the world. Furthermore, it will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity to the evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on a student’s performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the following guidelines.

Outline of Choice-Based Credit System

Core course: A course which should be compulsorily studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed a core course. The core course, also referred to as the Discipline-Specific Core (DSC) course, ensures that all institutions follow a common curriculum so that each institution adheres to a common minimum standard. The course, designed under this category, aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.

Elective Course: Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialised or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate’s proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study and are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by the main discipline/subject of study).

Dissertation/Project: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplementary study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

1. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and Skill Elective Course (SEC).

1.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): “AECC” courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These courses: (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication, are mandatory for all disciplines. AECC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

1.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge. The main purpose of these courses is to provide the students with life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

The fee structure is subject to changes as notified by the University from time to time.

Concession in fee is allowed as per the rules applicable.

No student will be readmitted for the third time in the session.

MIGRATION RULES

- No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the university. A migrating student will not be admitted to the college if the subjects/courses studied by him/her previously are not available or not in a combination decided by the college.
- The migrating student must submit the following documents/information:
 - Lecture Attendance Statement (of all subjects offered)
 - Statement of credit earned by the student under CCA.
 - Character certificate from the principal of the college last attended.

3. After migration has been sanctioned and notified by the H.P. University, the student must join the second college within the time period stipulated by the university
4. The admission of a student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/she produces the migration certificate issued by the university and a certificate of good conduct issued by the head of the institution last attended.

A student disqualified by another university shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification

Identity Card

- It is mandatory for every student to carry their college identity card within the college premises.
- A student without an identity card is deemed an outsider. In the event of an inspection of an identity card during a surprise check or for any other reason, if the student is found without an identity card, he/she will be handed over to the police or as the situation may demand.
- The students are not permitted to replace their photographs on the identity cards due to any reason whatsoever.
- It is the personal responsibility of the student to keep their identity card in safe custody. In case it is lost or gets misplaced, one has to file an FIR in order to get a duplicate identity card issued.

LEAVE RULES

General leave rules:-

1. Students can proceed on leave with prior permission of Principal recommended by senior tutor.
2. A tutor can recommended leave up to 6 days for longer duration i.e. up to 10 days, a student must get the application signed by the Senior Tutor.
3. Leave on account of unavoidable circumstances during House Examination/Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Senior Tutor.
4. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

❖ Duty leave rules

1. Participation by the students in Sports/Cultural/Co-Curricular activities, Inter-College/University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition(s). Duty leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity In-charge, prior proceeding to the event.

LIBRARY RULES

1. Identity Card Requirement

All students must bring their valid ID or library card when visiting the library. This must be produced upon request by the librarian.

- Loss of ID or library card must be reported to the librarian immediately.
- **No student will be allowed entry without a valid identity card.**

2. Book Issuing Rules

- A maximum of **two books** can be issued to one student at a time.
- Books are issued for a period of **15 days**.
- Students must return books **on or before the 15th day**.
- A late fine of **₹1 per day** will be charged for each overdue book.
- Books issued are **not transferable** to other students.

3. Library Conduct

- **Electronic instruments** and **eatables** are strictly prohibited inside the library.
- Students are **responsible for the safekeeping** of their belongings.
- **Use of mobile phones** inside the library is strictly prohibited. Violation of this rule will result in a **special fine of ₹200**.

4. Loss or Damage of Books

- In case of loss or damage of a library book, the student must either **replace the book** or **pay the cost of the book plus an additional 20%** as a penalty.

SCHOLARSHIPS, FEE CONCESSIONS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The College is deeply committed to ensuring that financial constraints do not hinder any student's pursuit of higher education. To support our academic community, the Scholarship Committee actively guides and assists students in applying for and securing various scholarship schemes sponsored by both Central and State Governments across multiple categories.

We strongly encourage all eligible students to explore these opportunities during their admission process to help fund their academic journey.

We are proud to share that in the current academic year; the committee has successfully verified applications for approximately 30% of our eligible student body. A significant majority of our students are actively opting for and benefiting from these financial aid programs.

Important Note Regarding Disbursement: The college acts strictly as a facilitating and verifying authority. All scholarship amounts are officially sanctioned by the respective Government Ministries. Approved funds are credited directly into the students' personal bank accounts via **Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT)**.

Students are advised to regularly check the National Scholarship Portal (NSP) and the college notice board for detailed eligibility criteria, application deadlines, and a complete list of active schemes.

❖ **Community led scholarships:**

- 1) **Lala Shri Jagdish Chand Mahajan Scholarship:** Under this scheme, a scholarship of Rs 5,000 for meritorious students is being instituted by Shri Sanjeev Mahajan in memory of his father.
- 2) **Inspector Mahendra Pal Dhiman Merit Award:** Under this scheme, a scholarship of Rs 5,000 for meritorious students is being initiated by Dr. Harbans Lal Dhiman in honour of his brother.

NOTICE BOARD

All the students must read the notices which are pasted on the College Notice Board or displayed on one-notice board on a regular basis to keep acquainted with the latest developments in the college.

ANTI-RAGGING

All students are hereby cautioned that ragging is a criminal offence. Ragging includes any type of physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual or group, either by words or by conduct, which creates an apprehension in the mind of the person that he/she cannot pursue his/her studies from any mental disturbance or torture created thereby. Any person who aids or encourages such an action shall also be guilty of such ragging." Ragging in and around the college/hostel campus or on roads/approaches leading there is strictly prohibited. If any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged under Rule 22.17 (a) (b) (c) of H.P. University to expel the guilty student(s) from the college/hostel and to report the matter to the police, as ragging amounts to a criminal offence as per the recent judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble H.P. High Court and the Govt. of H.P.

❖ **Punishments**

The students indulging in ragging will be punished by law with:

1. Cancellation of admission and withholding/withdrawing scholarship and any other benefit.
2. Debarring from appearing in any test, examination or any other evaluation process.
3. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international tournament, youth festival, etc.
4. Suspension from college and consequent debarring from admission to any other institute.

5. Fine of up to Rs. 50,000/- or imprisonment to 3 years or both.

All the students admitted to the college shall be deemed to have given the following undertaking:

“I have gone through the rules and regulations regarding ragging and discipline of the university/college, and I hereby solemnly affirm that I will not indulge in any act of ragging/indiscipline and that if I am found guilty of such offences as are covered under these rules, I will have no claim against the order of rustication/expulsion from the college.”

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE

- ❖ **NSS:** The National Service Scheme unit of the college works actively towards social welfare and promotes national integration under the able leadership of the experienced faculty.
- ❖ **Rovers & Rangers:** The college has well-organized units of Rangers (for boys) & Rangers (for girls), which give an opportunity to the students to improve their personality and develop leadership qualities under the guidance of able teachers.
- ❖ **Educational Tours and Excursions:**

Various educational tours, excursions and picnics are permitted during the academic session with certain conditions as follows:

1. Every educational tour and excursion will be accompanied by the teacher and needs prior permission.
2. A student must possess a written consent from the parent before going on any educational tour, excursion or picnic.

CELLS, CLUBS AND ASSOCIATIONS

❖ Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been set up in the college to ensure and enhance the quality of education and overall institutional performance, as mandated by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Its main goal is to improve various aspects of the college, including academics, administration, and the learning environment, through continuous quality improvement initiatives.

❖ Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell is a vital resource centre that helps students explore and achieve their career goals. It acts as a bridge between the student and the job market, providing services like career counselling, workshops, and placement assistance. The Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the college guides the student regarding different career avenues open to them in their respective fields through the notice

board, organising training programmes and arranging lectures by experts and resource persons.

❖ **Anti-Ragging Cell**

An Anti-Ragging Cell, with the Principal as the Chairman, has been formed to sensitize the students about the menace of ragging which has sullied the names of many reputed institutions. The following measures have been undertaken by the institution to ensure a safe environment for the new entrants:

1. Installation of CCTV cameras at vital points in the college.
2. Making students aware of the consequences of indulging in any form of ragging through notice boards.
3. Regular counselling of students by the members of the Anti-Ragging Cell.
4. The students also are required to give an undertaking at the time of admission that they are aware of the rules and regulations regarding ragging and are also aware of the consequences and shall not indulge in any form of ragging, which is an offence punishable under law.

❖ **Committee against Sexual Harassment of women at workplace (Internal Complaints Committee)**

The Internal Complaints Committee of the college is established to address and resolve complaints of sexual harassment, ensuring a safe and conducive environment for students and staff. The ICC functions under the guidelines of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, and the UGC Regulations, 2015.

❖ **Disaster Management Cell**

This cell, with the support of police personnel and home guards, makes sincere efforts to train and produce a team of young, alert and informed enthusiasts who will be able to work with phenomenal speed without losing equanimity of mind in the event of any natural or man-made disaster.

❖ **Research and Development Cell**

The R&D cell of the college provide a platform for the students and faculty wherein essential awareness about the scope and skills in the field are disseminated.

❖ **Red Ribbon Club**

The Red Ribbon Club of the college, is a student-led organization focused on raising awareness about HIV/AIDS and promoting healthy lifestyles among youth. Red Ribbon Club is a movement initiated by the Government of India to educate youth and other members of the community about sexuality, HIV/AIDS, and responsible behavior.

❖ **Eco Club**

The Eco Club of the college is a student-led initiative focused on promoting environmental awareness and action. 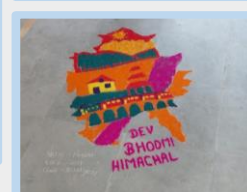
